

# PRAY FOR THE MANYIKA OF MOZAMBIQUE

Have you ever had to wait for something for a really, really, really, long time? Sometimes waiting is fun. Like when you're in the movie theatre, waiting for the show to begin or waiting for the next book in the series you're loving to come out. Sometimes waiting isn't fun at all. Like waiting in the doctor's office and wondering if you're going to have to get a shot. Or waiting in line at Wal-Mart on a Saturday afternoon. The truth is, life is full of waiting. Think about it. You're probably waiting for something right now, aren't you? What is it?

There is an unreached, unengaged people group in the country of Mozambique called the Manyika. The Manyika are warm, friendly people who grow their own food and raise sheep, cattle, and goats. They are animistic in their spiritual beliefs, which means that they believe non-living and/or non-human things, can have a spirit or soul. They have also been exposed to Catholicism, the Zionist church and various cult-like groups.



Just like you, the Manyika are waiting. They might be waiting for the rains to come or waiting for market day to sell their goods. The kids might be waiting to go back to school or to be done with school. But there's something else that they're waiting for that they might not even be aware of. The Manyika have not yet heard the true gospel. Let's pray that God will prepare laborers to go out into this harvest field and make Himself known among these waiting people.



Don't forget to pray for the Manyika children, too! Next time you're in a line or your marking days off a calendar in anticipation, remember that, like the Manyika, there are children all over the world who have not yet heard the gospel. Not only that but some of these children are so far from the gospel that it seems impossible that they'll ever get to hear. But our great God, who made a pathway on the sea floor for an entire nation to pass through, and shut the mouths of hungry lions to save his servant, and made a feast for thousands of people out of 2 fish and 5 loaves of bread, has shown us time and time again, that nothing is impossible for Him.
