

PRAY FOR THE ZIGUA OF TANZANIA



Have you ever been to Vacation Bible School, otherwise known as VBS? Just say Y Y Y Y Yes to V V V VBS. Don't worry if you don't get that joke, you had to be there. VBS is usually a super fun week, full of games, crafts, music, and the gospel. The music is so catchy that by the end of the week your parents are likely singing it too. Did you know that often churches want to plan a fun VBS not only for the children of that church but also to invite children who don't go to church and might not have ever heard the gospel?



The Zigua of the northeastern part of Tanzania, is an unreached, unengaged people group which means that they have little or no access to the true gospel. Although this group of a half a million people might say they believe in the creator God and acknowledge that He is powerful, they don't yet know that it is even possible to have a relationship with God, who is also a loving Father to those who are in Him. They are also becoming more and more influenced by Islam and less and less open to hearing the gospel. BUT, there is a small group of Zigua believers AND there are Zigua children who have heard the gospel and some Bible stories in an English class that they've attended.

Pray that the Zigua will hear the message that the God that they respect and fear, sent His only Son to make a way in His death and life, so that whoever believes in Him will be saved and loved as children of God. Pray for the very few Zigua believers, that they will stand firm in their faith and boldly share the good news with their own communities and beyond!



Let's also pray for the Zigua children. Imagine that what they learned at English class is a little like what you have learned at VBS and maybe just like you they go home and tell their parents, grandparents, siblings, cousins, friends, and anyone who will listen the good news that Jesus loves them and wants them to know Him. What if this message could be as catchy as a VBS song that gets so stuck in your head that you'll probably never forget it. May this gospel song be lifted up in the hearts of the Zigua and God glorified throughout northeastern Tanzania and to the ends of the Earth!
