

PRAY FOR THE OKPAMHERI OF NIGERIA




The Okpamheri number less than 100,000 and are found only in the southern portion of Nigeria.

In the mid-19th century, a group of Okpamheri villages and towns gathered together in unity to stave off slave raiders. Today, in a nod to their history, the term

“Okpamheri” can be used to mean “we are one.” The Okpamheri are very hospitable and peaceful. They are typically farmers who live in a collection of towns and

villages in the Edo state of Nigeria. While the Okpamheri have their own language, many from the younger generation do not speak it, choosing instead to speak more predominant languages like English or Yoruba.

- Pray that the Okpamheri would not give in to animism or believe false gospels that are prevalent in their country.
- Pray that God would use the unity that’s valued among the Okpamheri to bring entire villages to Christ at one time. Pray their new motto would be, “We are one church!”
