6 THINGS YOU MIGHT NOT KNOW ABOUT AFRICA

1 The average Sub-Saharan African lives on \$4 a day. That's the cost of a large caffe latte in the United States. Many Africans survive day to day, and it's tough to see a way out of their circumstances. But Christ provides hope that surpasses earthly suffering. Missionaries are needed to share this hope!



2 Sub-Saharan Africans value relationships over tasks. It's easy to strike up a conversation, and most people are happy to sit and chat, even about spiritual matters. Relationships are more important than any task – which makes it easy to find people who are willing to talk about God's Word.



3 In Sub-Saharan Africa, 62% of the population is under age 25. It's projected that by 2050 one-third of the world's youth will live here. African youth are concerned about education, jobs, marriage and family. They're hungry for peers and mentors who will proclaim love and truth into their lives.



4 Sub-Saharan Africa is home to many of the world's fastest growing cities. It's projected that by 2100, the three largest cities on earth will be here. As Africans flock to cities, they need to hear the gospel from churches that help them grow in their faith and share it with others. Innovative missionaries are needed to drive strategies to engage Africa's cities.

5 Sub-Saharan Africa has the most refugees and internally displaced peoples. Over 22 million Africans have fled their homes due to violence, natural disaster and persecution. As Christians share the gospel, refugee camps are transforming from places of despair to ones of hope. Come demonstrate the love of Christ among vulnerable peoples.

6 More Christians live in Sub-Saharan Africa than any other region. By 2060, four out of ten Christians in the world are expected to live here. The challenge is, many Africans have been swayed by false teachings and do not follow the true gospel. But if African believers are discipled and equipped, they could become a powerful missionary force!
