Salvation in South Asia

A family in South Asia rejoices to be among the new believers in 2022, thanks to your generosity that provided food for the hungry. South Asia is one region where hunger is great, and His provision through you has been greater.

After this family received a food bag, they were very responsive to the gospel and eager to learn more about the Bible. In time, the wife and oldest daughter committed their lives to Christ, and a few months later, the husband did as well. Now, the entire family attends church regularly, and a group meets in their home weekly for Bible study and prayer.

"A Prayer for Ukraine"

My God, I pray for our Ukraine, My God, I pray to You for the people, You forgive them, You save them, And show us Your mercy, My God, I know, that You will be with us.

ome eyes were glassy with tears as voices rose to sing these lines in the community-center-turned church in Zory, Poland. This worship song existed before the war but took on a new meaning because of what happened in the church members' homeland.

"If you want to make any Ukrainian cry these days, you play that song," said Dan Upchurch, one of the pastors and founders of Christian

Community Church of Zory, Poland. Dan and his wife, Lori, are IMB missionaries. They also had to flee because of the war. They understand how their church family feels because they live and serve among them.

After singing "A Prayer for Ukraine," Vadim, who leads worship with his wife, Oksana, told those gathered that it's easy to be discouraged by all the terrible things happening in Ukraine.

"If you can't run, walk to God. If you can't walk, crawl to God," he encouraged the group.



Vadim and Oksana fled Crimea in 2014 when Russia seized control and moved into mainland Ukraine. They fled again after the 2022 invasion. They learned the lesson of running to God in a time of upheaval before many Ukrainians did.

The church meets in a room that looks like a dance studio. The mirrored walls give the illusion of twice the number of people—which is a chilling thought when you imagine it representing the husbands, fathers, and brothers who are not there because they couldn't leave Ukraine. Men between the ages of 17 and 60 are not allowed to leave in case they are needed to fight. Regular members are passionate about serving. Their church is like a family, especially since they are separated from theirs. Luba makes coffee each week and helps with the children. Sasha does it all. He helps with sound for the service, teaches Sunday School, and preaches.

Ukrainians have been uprooted from not only their home, cities, and community, but they are also separated from their faith family. Many Ukrainians attend church services in the language of their host countries. The men, women, and children in this room are thankful they can worship in their heart language. The first time Dan invited people to respond to the gospel, a woman said she had been meaning to take that step of faith. She was passing through and had Dan not given the invitation, she may have continued to delay her decision.

Radick also committed his life to Christ at this church, and church members recently celebrated his baptism. His conversion brought tears to the eyes of Bartosz and Zhanna, who have invested in him since childhood. Bartosz, who is Polish, served in Ukraine as a missionary with his wife, Zhanna, who is Ukrainian. In a recent sermon from Ephesians 1:15-23, Dan told the believers in order to grow spiritually, they need a deeper understanding of Christ's position and their position in Him. If Christians don't understand Christ's exalted position in the universe, they will not understand all that they have in Him and will keep asking the Lord to give what they already possess in Christ.



This message encourages them in a time when it seems Ukrainians' world is in tatters. Jesus will be with them, even as missiles fall and hearts on this side of heaven are shattered.

Visual Scripture resonates in Deaf African hearts

bdulai had never heard the name of interpreter at a Muslim service or event. or read about a Savior in the Bible.

"My entire family is Muslim, and no one ever told me about Jesus," he said. "Being a Muslim, nothing gave me hope."

Everything changed when a friend invited him to an evangelical church that was interpreted into sign language. This was different from anything he'd experienced. He never had an

Jesus. As one of Africa's many Deaf Abdulai learned who Jesus was, developed a peoples, that's understandable. But heart connection with Him and became a he'd never seen Jesus' name signed believer. His life hasn't been the same since.

> "It was through the Scriptures that I began to see. But it was very surface because I still, even after being baptized, didn't have Scripture in my own heart language," he said.

This isn't the first time we've seen a lack of access to Scripture among the Deaf in Africa. In fact, we often find that most do not read or write, making it difficult to know the truths of the gospel.





Even for those who are literate, their heart language is the sign language specific to their country. A written Bible just doesn't communicate the truths in a way they can fully understand.

With this in mind, IMB missionaries invited Abdulai, along with several others, to a StoryOne Camp. This camp is a periodic event we host along with Deaf Pathway Global, a partnering ministry organization. The project's goal was to teach attendees to translate eight Bible stories into the sign languages of Senegal, Burkina Faso, Niger, Sierra Leone, and The Gambia.

Attendees at the camp learned not only how to sign these specific stories, but also how to illustrate some of these stories and larger Bible concepts with pen and paper. The concepts and stories are easy to replicate and understand, especially by someone who does not read or write. Mnemonic hand movements assist Deaf nationals in recalling it for evangelizing and discipling.

"Abdulai's love for Jesus grew by leaps and bounds when he saw what [Jesus] did for him," IMB missionary Paul Yount shared. "He needed to see stories from the Bible translated into his heart language to understand, appreciate, love, and be transformed by God."





Paul Yount and Willie Brown are IMB missionaries who facilitate StoryOne Camps. Thankfully, through your generosity to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering, Abdulai was able to attend two more camps in 2022. He was trained in Bible stories on the identity of Jesus and functions of the church.



"He now has a repertoire of stories that he can use for evangelizing the Deaf and helping believers plant new churches in their communities," Yount said.

When you support projects like this, you enable long-term workers to evangelize, train disciples, educate church leaders, and provide resources to plant indigenous, Deaf-led, self-sustaining, reproducing Deaf churches using those core stories. Together, we reach the nations with the gospel.



DEAF PEOPLES

NO ACCESS

An estimated 72 million culturally Deaf have almost no access to Scripture in their heart language.

SIGN ROOTS

Although there are nearly 300 different sign languages, many share foundations that we call sign roots. IMB missionaries use sign roots as the basis for translating 300 Bible stories into multiple sign languages.

JESUS' NAME

The majority of the Deaf have never seen Jesus' name signed in their language. Often ignored and oppressed, the Deaf are some of the least evangelized people on earth.

Missionary presence changes lives

Damir sat by the side of the road, destitute and crying. He prayed God would either help him or let him die. His employer hadn't paid him. He couldn't pay his rent and his family disowned him.

Four local churches, national believers, and IMB missionaries know the world's greatest problem is lostness. They see it every day in Central Asia. They see the spiritual darkness that traps many like Damir.

Through your faithful prayers and giving, they've found a way to engage the lost through the House of Hope, a halfway house for recovering alcohol and drug addicts. House of Hope provides shelter, job skills training, and fellowship. Men staying at the House of Hope also participate in Bible studies and prayer times. They hear the gospel and see it lived out.

Damir is thriving and is set up for success so he can be a gospel witness in his community. Thank you for being a part of the work—the most important work we can imagine.



We've identified 3,072 people groups across the globe who have no missionary presence and likely no gospel access.

They live in jungles and across deserts. They are on islands and across mountains.

Their villages are remote. Some live in cities, others in isolated communities.

So we're preparing to go to the deepest part of lostness to find the people no one else is looking for.

This pioneering initiative, Project 3000, will create 100 new jobs each year over three years. Each of these missionaries will be exploring 10 people groups over a two year period.

People group changed by the gospel

What does it look like when we commit to the hard work of reaching a people group with the good news of Jesus? Consider the Manyika of Mozambique.

For the Manyika, the problem was accessibility, especially during the rainy season when roads were washed away. Praise God for IMB missionaries and their local partners who were willing to traverse the bad mountainous roads to share Bible truths. Now there is a gospel presence among the Manyika. Each time they return, the crowd under the shade tree grows larger and more people are turning to Christ.

believing women from a region in Nepal where most tribes are Hindu and worship forest deities. Since this training, the women have been busy sharing their testimonies and the gospel. One has led four other women to faith in Christ. When the believing men saw the women confidently leading others to Christ, they asked for an opportunity for training as well. CASH GIFTS

Cash gifts are an easy way to have an impact today, while possibly reducing your tax liability. Aside from gifts via check or credit card, some take advantage of a Qualified Charitable Distribution from their IRA (age qualified) or distributions from a Donor Advised Fund.

NON-CASH & TANGIBLE GOODS

While 80% of giving is traditionally cash, it usually only represents 3% of the average person's total wealth. The remaining 97% are non-cash assets, such as real estate, commodities, stocks, cryptocurrency, and business interest but also, vehicles and other tangible property.

LEGACY GIFTS

Legacy planning secures kingdom impact long term. Yet, 67% have no estate plan. Planning for the future does not have to be daunting. We have developed a network of planning partners to help you and your family to identify strategic options suited for your overall charitable goals.

Dawit was a security guard, translator, friend, and family member. He was your missionaries' door to communities with no gospel presence in Northern Africa. Over a 13-year period, Dawit helped eight IMB families and 16 short-term missionaries. He was not a believer when he first met IMB missionaries, but through their continued witness, he understood what it meant to be saved and gave his life to Jesus. Dawit is now with the Lord, and the missionaries rejoice to know that his eternity is secure.

The long-term commitment that leads to this kind of relationship is possible through your faithfulness to IMB missionaries. They are present and among the lost, building relationships that lead to Jesus.

CURRENT CONFLICTS

65% of the world's current conflicts are happening in Northern Africa and the Middle East creating the great opportunity to bring the gospel to refugees who wouldn't otherwise have opportunity to hear.

MAJOR RELIGIONS

The world's major religions — Islam, Judaism, and Christianity — all have significant populations in Northern Africa and the Middle East.

DIGITALLY CONNECTED

Roughly 8 in 10 people from Northern Africa and the Middle East use social media. This allows IMB teams to reach thousands of people with gospel messages using digital resources.

6 THINGS to make your mission trip **IMPACTFUL** by Tina Louderback, missionary to Panama



Let's face it, churches spend a lot of money and time doing short-term mission trips. If we are going to invest so much, let's do it right by being intentional from the beginning.

My husband, Tim, and I host teams taking entry-level mission trips in Panama. We suggest you add prayer to the following six things to make your mission trip impactful:

1. Flexible doesn't mean "wing it." Be prepared!

Try to paint a picture for your team about what they signed up to do. Not only will you have an immediate impact, but you'll have time to invest in relationships.

2. Partner with local believers.

Work with your IMB missionary but let us connect you to local believers, churches, and ministries. They will take over the task of discipleship after you go home.



3. If nationals can do it, you shouldn't. Ministering with national believers keeps dependency down. Spend time empowering, not enabling. Not only is this biblical but provides a reason for being in places tourists don't normally see.



4. The only solution you need is for lostness. Don't try to fix things. What you can fix is your new friend's eternity. Each day 173,451 people die without Christ. You have the solution for a lost world- the gospel!

A short-term trip can transform the entire church. Have a plan to get everyone involved from the beginning, during, and upon return. Your church will be forever changed by this experience.

It's going to take all of us working together to reach the nations. This may lead to ministries not only in another country but in your community.

5. The ENTIRE church should be involved.

6. Short-term trips should lead to long-term commitment.
