There, she was introduced to Jesus by missionaries who were also fleeing Vietnam. The missionaries loved the Vietnamese people so much that they went to the refugee camps to serve them.

She later moved to America, where she met her husband, Peter. Now, they both serve as missionaries—telling people about the good news the missionaries shared with Ruby all those years ago.

The couple shared the gospel and planted churches in the Philippines and another Asian country, and they even tried out retirement for less than a year. But their heart for the lost compelled them to go back to the field.

Now, they're in Taiwan and celebrating 25 years of serving as IMB missionaries!

We are grateful to the many Asians, Asian Americans, and Pacific Islanders for their obedience to God's call to the nations. We thank God for the thousands who have heard the gospel through their ministry.
